Humanitarian Observatory of the Argentine Red Cross







The Humanitarian Observatory of the Argentine Red Cross is a research, knowledge and awareness space that aims to better understand the different situations that our society goes through, from a humanitarian perspective.



OBSERVATORY STUDIES ALLOW TO:

- Identify humanitarian needs and vulnerability situations.
- Design projects with social impact and public policies.
- Raise awareness and educate to improve people's lives.





It collects information in person, virtually or by phone. Data recollection gives added value to the Observatory thanks to the voluntary collaborations of the 66 delegations that are part of the Argentine Red Cross network throughout the country.



It approaches in a consensual manner both perceptions, emotions, and feelings, as well as material and/or economic needs.



It gathers information from different Argentine regions: Buenos Aires Metropolitan Area, Center, Cuyo, Northeast, Northwest, and Patagonia. Therefore, it takes into consideration its vast extension, climate and cultural diversity, and the location of its inhabitants.



It complements the studies by monitoring with Big Data tools and by analyzing social media. This helps to identify crisis focal points and public opinion topics of interest.



It has developed strategic alliances with the Vatican Observatory (Specola Vaticana), the Consejo Interuniversitario Nacional (CIN), the Consejo de Rectores de Universidades Privadas (CRUP), the Observatorio Social de Infancias y Juventudes de Scouts de Argentina and other Red Cross and Red Crescent National Societies.



HUMANITARIAN INDICATOR OF THE RED CROSS (IHC)

The Humanitarian Indicator of the Red Cross has been developed to understand the interpersonal relationships between the different communities within the country. To accomplish that, it approaches social, economic, and psycho-affective variables, through questions associated to the Argentine Red Cross humanitarian values: support and relationships among community members, solidary acts, discrimination events, sense of belonging, awareness about the daily lives of the community, involvement in governmental policy, participation in actions that have communitarian impact, among others.







SERVICES GIVEN BY THE HUMANITARIAN OBSERVATORY OF THE ARGENTINE RED CROSS

The Humanitarian Observatory has a broad data analysis capacity to understand realities from different themes and populations. This enables it to provide services and research that meet the needs of public and private institutions, which share the same values and Fundamental Principles, for instance, non-governmental organizations, public organizations, or companies, among others.

In this way, it studies different situations, for example, a population's access to a specific right or, social perceptions like the ones associated to the COVID-19 pandemic, evaluating with strength and efficiency, monitoring, and following up the situations and challenges experienced by the society.

Research is fed from digital monitoring in real time through Big Data tools and Artificial Intelligence. This monitoring is a noninvasive analysis of the public content that circulates on social media to detect trends, measure perceptions, emotions, and citizenship concerns. The aim is to prevent a crisis focus.







The creation of **The Humanitarian Observatory** towards the end of 2019, allowed, for example, to obtain precise information to define a course of action and intervention in the face of the social and sanitary emergency declared by Salta province. The severe crisis that the region has experienced was revealed, mainly, by the death of indigenous children caused by malnutrition and alimentary unsafety, or illnesses associated with it, and also by the health deterioration of hundreds of people in similar conditions.

To better understand this situation, the Argentine Red Cross developed a thought through study in the area that allowed identifying the relation between the great number of malnutrition cases and the consumption of non-drinkable water. Thanks to the worthy collected data, it was decided to establish the first Humanitarian camp of the Argentine Red Cross in Santa Victoria del Este (Salta), that permitted the volunteers to assist and accompany these communities from their own place, give them access to safe water, improve their hygiene conditions, generate regular learning instances and improvements in their life conditions. Next, the Observatory carried out the follow-up and supervising of the lines of action executed to evaluate their effectiveness and strengthen them.







From the COVID-19 pandemic onwards, the Humanitarian Observatory adapted its strategy to gather information. In this way, it analyzed the impact that the pandemic had in all Argentine socioeconomic levels and areas, considering the access to rights to health, work, housing, education, and food. Also, obtaining data to identify vulnerabilities, needs and, the social and economic impact on the Argentine inhabitants.
